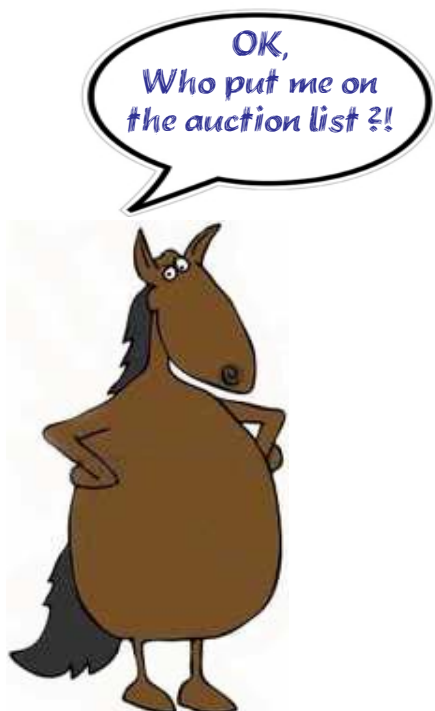
2. AGM SUGGESTIONS

We need to have an idea of possible numbers and we have to make the final decision by late August to get the official notification out in time.

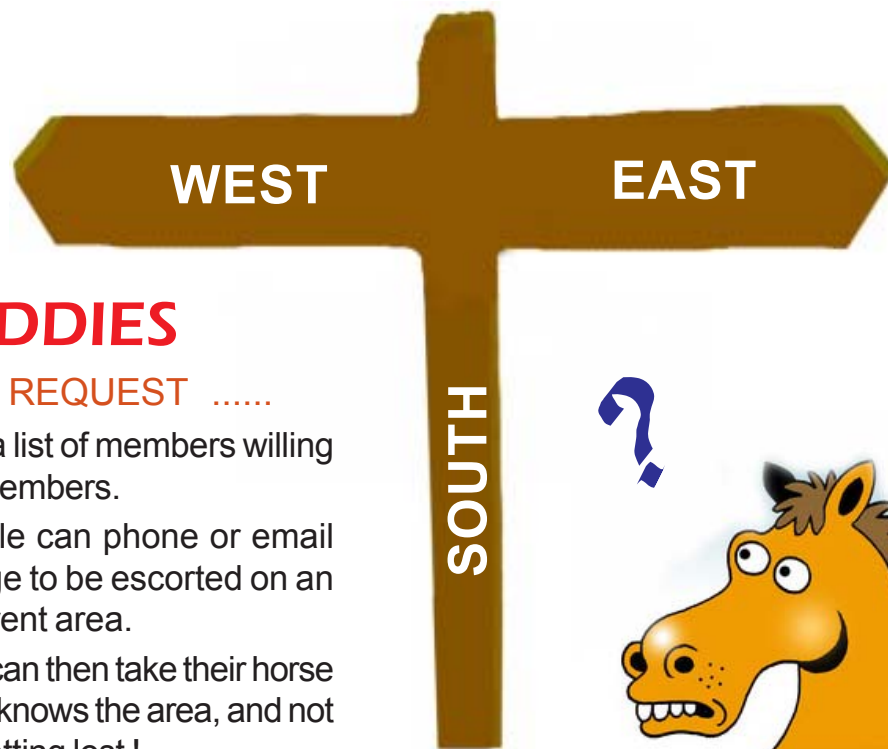

3. RIDE BUDDIES

FOLLOWING A REQUEST

We are looking to run a list of members willing to ride out with other members.

4. WORK GROUPS & TRAINING

FOLLOWING AN ENQUIRY ABOUT CLEARANCE AND LATCHES etc

Our BHS Affiliation allows us to form work parties for bridleway clearance but only permits the use of hand tools, and not any power tools. We have spoken to the Rights of Way Department about the use of brushcutters and strimmers etc., and they have a scheme which would allow this, provided that the members using the brushcutters or strimmers have the appropriate certificates. They already work with several groups in Gloucestershire doing this type of thing for conservation areas and footpaths, and are keen to expand this to working with Trails users.

We, as a Group, would nominate people to go on a brushcutting course at college to get a certificate, and PROW have indicated that they would pay for (probably) two people to do this. I believe the course is approx £100 per person, and the brushcutters would also be supplied by PROW for the actual work day, so we need people who are serious about taking this on, and probably people from different areas would be sensible for maximum benefit.

It is envisaged that this would be occasional work, rather than regular days, and less in the winter, but all this is up for discussion.

As well as the brushcutting, in order to make up a work party at the same time, or to be able to do other general work, such as Waymarking, Replacing Latches, Rehanging Gates etc.all volunteers would need to fill in a GCC Volunteer form, and all work done would require that we use GCC Risk Assessment and notification systems etc.

We also have to nominate a co-ordinator to liaise with GCC on all our work parties - it would be great if someone feels they could do this for the group.
